

Some learnings / feedback:

- Tough sell for younger age groups in Oct-Dec
- Might need a break after Fall programs
- Consider a single weekend camp (or during school breaks)
- Pitching clinics sometimes need more dedicated instruction vs. just repetitions
- Friday night in-season clinics were tough to sustain attendance
- Coach Skills clinic was good, but need more sessions throughout year
- Softball Intros were well received with the community, and effective for registrations

Photo Night

- Had to move dates twice (conflicts w/ other sports weekends & new CMSA opening weekend Friday games)

Division 1 ID Camps

- Indoors in January helpful but limited
- Moved outdoor in September (aligned with other clubs across Calgary)



- Junior Coach Program (formerly Mentor Program)
 - 26 players signed up, assigned to 20 teams
 - Significantly improved dynamic having player(s) stay with the same team
 - Great connections made, less administration work
 - Thank you <u>Jen Semenzin</u> for the idea on how to run it this season!

• New Skill Shark Evaluation Software

- Learning curve and some bugs to work through, but overall very positive feedback (evaluators)
- Saved time (no more entering data & managing in spreadsheet)
- Proved difficult to use during outdoor ID camps
- Coach player evaluations still done old methodology

• Porta-Potties

- \circ ~ New supplier (Rhino) was a huge improvement over previous season
- Still issues with missing locks
- Kudos and thank you to <u>Rob & Laura Mah</u> for their support this season!

• Timbits Opening Day

- Huge positive to start the season as an entire group set teams off on the right foot
- Great support by multiple experienced & Junior coaches to lead skill development





Season End Dates

- Div 3 families were happy with end of June Div 2 families like the early July completion
- •
- Div 1 split (50% prefer earlier July completion)

House league vs. CMSA (at u9/u11 levels)

A shift of respondents prefer to play in a WHS-only league (65%)

Offseason Programs

- No overwhelming preferences for day of week & time of day
- Pitching is preference (less for catching)
- Prefer split between Competitive & Junior; and multi-week sessions .
- Fall programs if couldn't participate, it was more due to scheduling conflicts

CMSA Feedback

- Positive towards schedule, game times Dislike field locations / distance

Optimal #:

- Everyone prefers 2 games per week
- u11 & u13 prefer increase to 2 practices/wk (u9 & u15/HS prefer 1)
- u13+ prefers at least 1 out-of-town tournament per year •
- u9/u11 prefer 1 In-town tournament: u13+ prefer 1 to 2 in-town tournaments .

Others:

- Very positive response for the amount of **communications** by WHS
- Overwhelming majority approval to keep **Porta-Potties** Significant vote of approval for our **new logo** .

2023 Year In Review - Challenges

WEST HILL

• Evaluation Process

- New documentation was created in 2023 for WHS evaluation policies (on website)
- Perceived biases felt in some age categories, concerns on how and who makes decisions
- Inexperience in our evaluator volunteers
- However, 88% felt results were accurate (and 75% rated evals 8+ out of 10).

• Gaps with many Coach Skill levels

- Start of year orientation (virtual) & fundamental skills training (in person) is limited
- Limited centralized training at Calgary Minor Softball level
- WHS Resources a work in progress; coaches not committed enough to spend time reviewing

Coach Volunteers

- West Hill coaches at more than one age category had disagreements with other WHS teams
- Availability gap at some levels (Div 3)

• Team Formation / Division 2A Level Teams

- West Hill unsuccessful at pushing CMSA for tiered Division 2 groupings to align skills
- \circ U13 Skillset is not varied enough to split this group
- \circ \qquad HS Division splits / skill range at lower level

Umpires

- Not enough coverage by CMSUA umpires (limited coverage outside HS & U15 Div 1)
- Recruiting new umpires has proven difficulty; shortage could be more problematic in 2024

Coach/Player Recruiting

- \circ 8 players from WHS transitioned to Adrenaline u11 level; Softball AB loose on rules
- \circ \hfill This fall, 6 players from the same team were recruited by Adrenaline u17

Initial Plans

- Continued refinement of our eval policies
- Evaluators from other age groups
- Attempt to increase evaluator skill knowledge
- Calgary Minor centralized coach training
- Host Community Softball course in spring
- Coach Resource Committee
- Look for better fit amongst co-coaches
- More active coach support by age category
- Scrap the in-division levels (unless CMSA adds 4th level)

- Support CMSUA recruiting plans
- Push more WHS teams to play at higher Div level
- Explore strategic alliances

Our Recommendations for Calgary Minor Softball in 2024



1. Season Length for Division 1

- Recommend reduction to mid-July
- Shorten playoffs complete all in one week

2. Reduction in the number of games / more practices

- For u9/u13: 1 bye night every two weeks;
- less games on Opening weekend for Div 3

3. Division Structures & Realignments during year

- Larger groupings to start year (u11+)
- Redo division alignments on May long weekend
- Consultation with districts & coaches for changes

4. Modified Division 3 rules for u11/u13

- Promote more game play (vs. walks)
- 5. Remove Open Inning for Division 1
 - 7 run max for all Div 1 & 2 (align with Softball AB rules)

6. Rethink Division 1 All-star Game

• Current format does not have value (1 hour game in September)



Volunteer Bond Summary

- Collected bonds at team level for first time in 2023
- \$150 Volunteer Bond + \$50 Jersey Bond
- 32 families opted out (highest at u13 & u15 levels)
- Overall success, increased participation at league events
- Thank you to: Misty Johnson, Tara Barker, Jocelyn Lalonde, Kathy Davies Murphy, and all Team Mgrs!

PAINS: Work hours to track all participation Some teams left short-handed (multiple opted out) Confusion with team vs. association level credits and multi-level requirement tracking Reliance on Team Manager to be the gatekeeper, dealing with non-payments



SOME IDEAS FOR 2024:

* Increase Bond Fee (e.g. \$300)
 * Collect Bond Fees at Evaluations (remove from Team Manager responsibility)

 * Remove team component
 (all parents assigned roles at team level)

Coordinator Reports



• Registrar (Rachel Sawyer, Marnie Doig, Nadine Griffith)

- We continue to see increased registrations year over year.
- A big thank-you to Marnie Doig for stepping in to help with registration questions and team roster submissions!
- Team Snap continues to be an effective tool to manage registrations for regular season, clinics and the tourney.

• Field & Gym Coordinator (Nicole Genereux)

- 200 home games played on WH diamonds this season with only one schedule conflict.
- Continuing to request more fields from the City (positive conversation between city & CMSA).
- Planning to make use of new Webber facility this winter
- Balance using turf fields (Absolute, Coyote Den) and local school gyms to keep costs down.

• Equipment Coordinator (Craig McDowell)

- All supply chain issues were resolved in 2023.
- Second JUGS Lite Flite Pitching machine was purchased for indoor use and a second outdoor JUGS pitching machine (with battery charger) to be purchased before the Spring'24 season.
- Most common items that got lost were fielding masks, indicators/brushes and home run cones.
- Most common broken items were tees, line marker rods and hitting net bags.
- Reminder that chalk is located in the yellow bin at Patterson and green bin at Glenrbook 3 (lots of confusion).



- Jersey Coordinator (Cathy Antaya)
 - Kept jerseys in "teams" after '23 season worked well last year.
 - Tried a number of jersey suppliers for 2023 unsuccessfully.
 - Exploring new jerseys with Play It Again Sports and purchase of new jerseys for 2024.

• Conflict Resolution Coordinator (Shireen Bond)

- 2023 season was an overall improvement from the previous season in terms of number of complaints, however, we continue to have issues and concerns that arise, with the bulk coming in during or right after evaluations.
- Concerns around the evaluation process, team formation and coach qualifications still remain the major themes.
- Significant feedback and concern regarding the 2A Divisions in U15 and U13. Board will make necessary adjustments for upcoming season.

• Volunteer Coordinator Update (Misty Johnson)

- Inaugural season thank you to Misty Johnson, Tara Barker (manager liaison) and Jocelyn Lalonde (credit tracking).
 Over 375 volunteer tasks that families signed up for.
- 12 volunteer bond cheques retained. The season was generally a success, but Misty has put forth several recommendations for 2024 which will be discussed at the Board level.

WHS 2024 Planning Updates



- What: Paid role with an hourly rate open to anyone; varying from 5-20 hours per week (peak periods being Jan-May)
- **Potential Cost impact**: \$15-20K (9-12% of our total annual revenue)
- **Comparable**: SBR also has a paid position (emulated from this one)
- **Benefits**: Ease strain on volunteer roles (President, Registrar, etc.); provide more timely responses to members; increase ability to recruit new volunteers, etc.
- Responsibilities:
 - **Registration activities**

(set-up forms, answer questions, roster creations, data entry, apply fees and refunds to participants, tournament registrations, etc.)

• **Communications** (emails to participants, website updates, social media, for all WHS events, preseason meeting invites, google surveys, etc.)

• Offseason Clinic & Spring Evaluation support (general logistics, create volunteer sign-up forms, etc.)

• Board Activities

(prepare agenda, calendar invites, and secretary role at board meetings once a month & AGM, maintain action register)

• Field & Gym Coordination

(secure diamond and indoor gym bookings with city / facilities, coordinate field schedules with Calgary Minor, ensure permits are available)

- Other administrative tasks as assigned
- Full details of the position requirements will be posted on our website shortly. Interviews expected in November.

CMSA 2024 Planning Updates

- WESTHIL
- Limited information from Calgary Minor to date (October Board meeting cancelled, September Softball AB Zone meeting cancelled)
- **Schedule** has been <u>posted</u> for 2024. CMSA has kept the Tiered Division scheduling (e.g. staggered end dates)
- **AGM** scheduled for March 12, 2024
- All-Star Game will be reimagined in 2024 (did not work well in '23)
- Removed "If Necessary" final game from playoff format
- Seeking Volunteer **Category Chairs** at Calgary Minor level
- **Police Check Process** is changing (CPS has changed system process)
- **Coach Training Programs** being developed (led by Kyle Osterman) (recognize that it is our biggest gap right now .. well second to lack of umpires)



- Offseason programs
 - Initial programs Oct-Dec (Pitch clinic Nov-Feb)
 - Rustbusters will occur in January (Registration in December)

Ideas for the Board/Discussion

- Encourage more female coaches
- More WHS banners for teams
- Consider Coach Haley Acton from U of C for our pitching clinics (Morty)
- Porta Potty on both fields for Glenbrook?
- Porta Potty placement at Signal Hill
- Accessible Sea-Can / storage box for our pitching machines and other shared league equipment
- Evaluations have skill-based training sessions, and evaluate through learning drills (include instruction at the same time and gauge coachability of players)
- Request experienced coaches at WHS to commit to evaluations for a specific age group and not in the age group they are coaching to remove potential biases. Additional transparency with player placements and evaluations
- Mandate the use of masks in the outfield (in addition to infield)
- Provide more volunteer opportunities at the association level during the season
- Link volunteer bond with umpiring (there will be another shortage of umpires next season)
